Happy New Year! 2006 is in the books.

The big news is the project we have been involved in with regards to annexing out to our pioneer boundaries has finally been finished. We accomplished all necessary steps and toward the end of the process, we were served with three protests to our actions. All three were from one person living to our west in Warren who wants to incorporate Warren as a city and wants us to wait until he is finished so we do not take any land he wants in his new town. We are following the desires of the landowners and see their rights to choice as the most important issue. The Weber County Boundary Commission agreed with us and dismissed the protests. We have finished the process of filing and recording and we welcome the new members of the community and hope they find life in Plain City as rewarding as we do.

Building continues at a breakneck pace here in our city. We are doing our best to control it and thank our Planning Commission for their efforts in making sure all new development meets our requirements.

Weber School District continues on the new elementary school. You can watch the progress on 3900 west between 2200 north and Center Street. They still anticipate opening for class with the 2007 school year.

We currently have an opening in our public works dept. and are taking resumes. Anyone interested should contact anyone at City Hall.

Work continues on our Fire Station addition. It will be just in time as our Fire Dept. was successful in receiving a grant for a new grass truck with a pumper unit on the bed. This will help considerably with our rural makeup of our town and the added responsibility to our west. We would like to thank Derrick Barber for his extra efforts in working on the grass truck project.

Our next big event in the city will be our 17th of March celebration. We look forward to that and encourage everyone to attend that event. Details to follow.

Our General Plan update continues and is reaching the final stages of review with the Planning Commission and will come to the City Council for further review and public input. We will post times when you can see it in the near future.
